HIT THE ROAD

1. Reflect on the past week and think of a time when you rushed into a situation and solved it your own way.

Was a relationship with someone else impacted?
How?

This week, be aware of times when you are tempted to rush in with your own way or answer. Instead, choose to give God room to work. Record your experience.

2. For each person, surrender to God will look different. Today, what will you give up (or do differently) in exchange for time with God?

At the end of the day, ask God and consider whether this is a one time surrender or if it is something you should surrender again tomorrow. (This could be a moral, physical or oral surrender.)

3. Read Proverbs 3:5-6.

What is one thing that you will entrust to the Lord as you surrender it to Him this week?

Cut off the car below with the Proverbs 3:5-6 verses. Punch two holes and tie a string through the car and hang from your rearview mirror. (If you don't drive, put it on your bathroom mirror or another prominent place.) Use your time in the car (or while you are getting ready), allowing yourself to surrender one thing to God. While in your car, trust God with this issue. Ask Him to help you and thank Him for whatever happens.
